



On June 11, from 6 to 9 pm, Friends of the Banks Library will be hosting a dinner and auction event at David Hill Winery to raise funds for the Jane Moore Community Room. Tickets are \$40 per person or \$300 for a table of 8, and may be purchased at the library or City Hall.

The Banks Public Library is in many ways the heart of our community. As use of the library has grown, so have the needs of the community for a low-cost, versatile public meeting space. In 2014, the library launched a capital campaign to build a 1,000 square-foot community room addition. We are very close to reaching our fundraising goals, with just \$25,000 remaining to be raised from the community.

The community room will provide program and meeting space, high speed Internet, the latest in telecommunication technology, and a local weather measurement and reporting station. It will be named after Jane Moore in honor of her many years of support establishing the Banks Library.

Funding for the project is coming from many sources, including the City of Banks, Washington County Gain Share Funds, foundation grants, and community-raised funds.

Your Sheriff's Office was honored as the **2015 DUII Enforcement County Agency of the Year** by the Oregon DUII Multi-Disciplinary Training Task Force. The award acknowledges DUII prevention work and a

commitment to community education. For 10 of the last 13 years, your Sheriff's Office has had the honor of receiving this prestigious award.

Our commitment to DUII enforcement is clear. Your Sheriff's Office has arrested 11,001 DUII drivers over the last 10 years. That is an average of **1,100 per year**, not including arrests by other agencies in our county. In 10 years, your Sheriff's Office has arrested nearly enough DUII drivers to fill Hillsboro Stadium and Ron Tonkin Field to CAPACITY!
