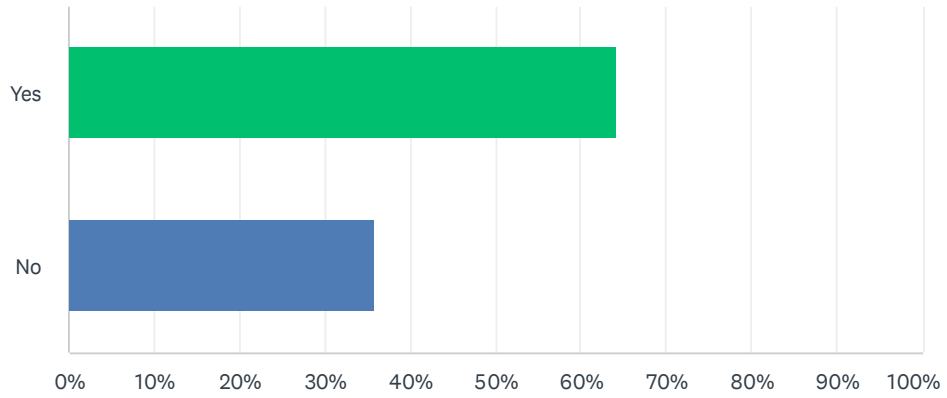


Q1 Are you a resident of the City of Banks (Do you live inside the city limits?)

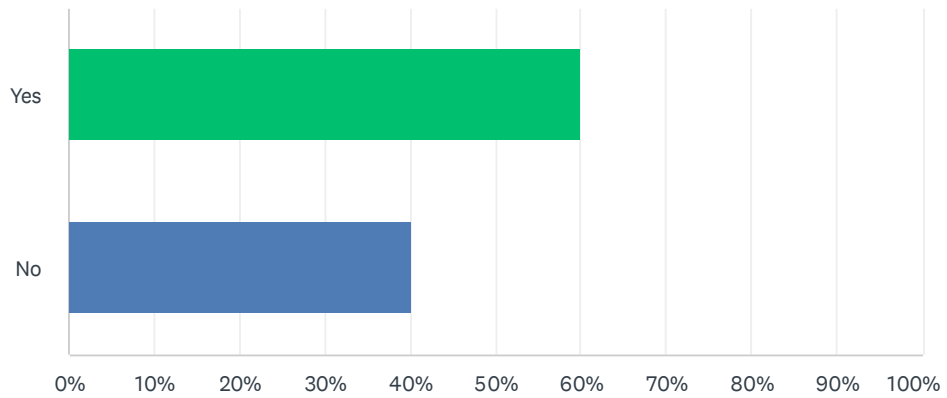

Q2 Are you familiar with the Banks Urban Renewal Plan?

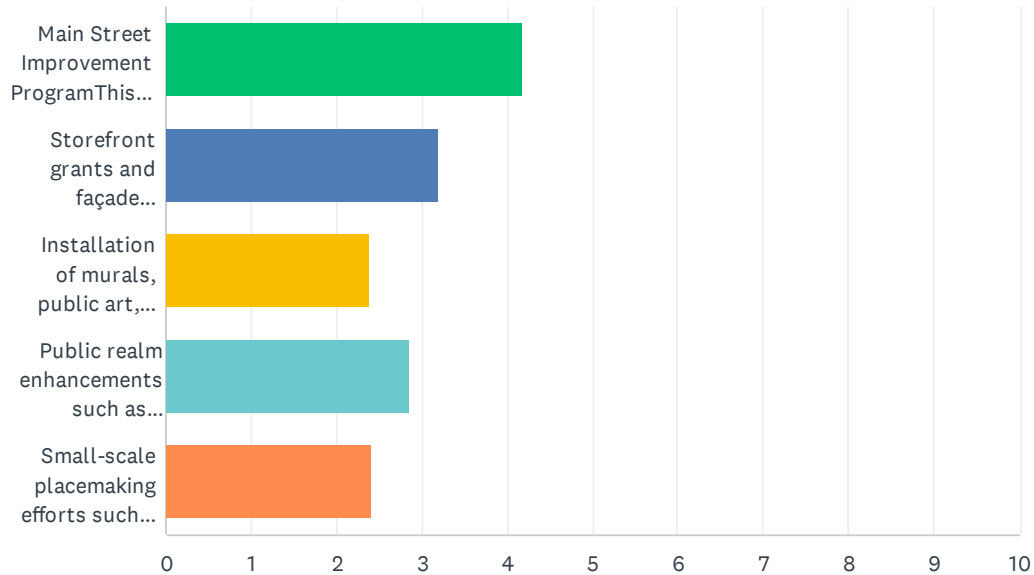

Q3 Rank these District Identity projects by order 1 through 5, with 1 being the most important to you.

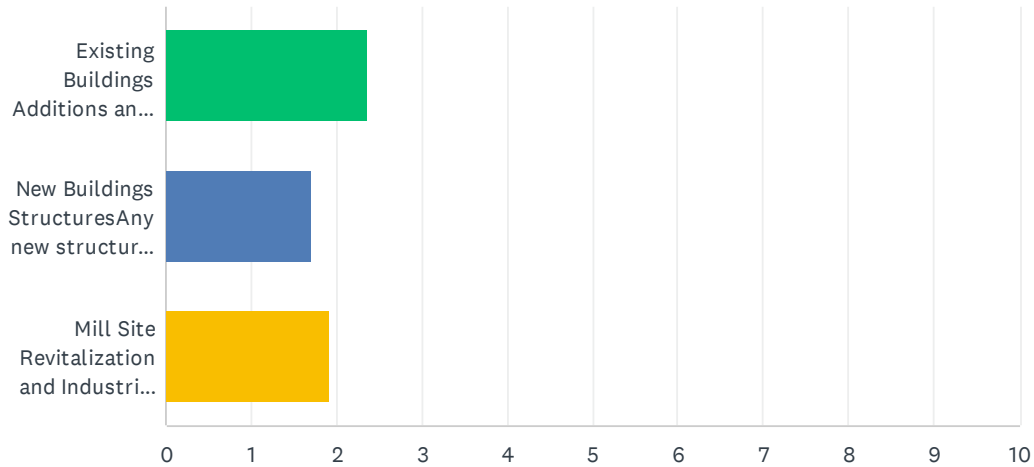

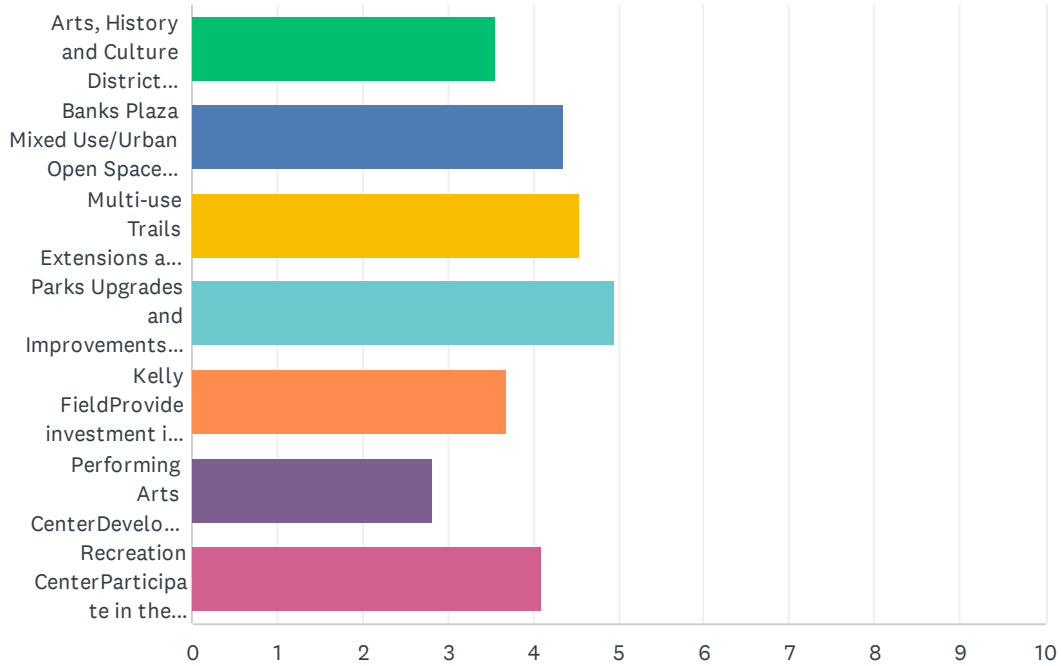
